GETTING HERE FROM BANGOR

Take I-95 north 42 miles to exit 227 Lincoln (US-2/ME-RT6/ME-116) and turn right. Go 4 miles and turn left at the light onto US-2/ME-6. Follow ME-RT 6 East for 33 miles, passing through down-town Lincoln and Lee. In Springfield, turn right onto Bottle Lake Road. Go 6 miles and turn right onto Depot Rd. Go 1.5 miles and turn left onto East Shore Rd. In 1.5 miles turn left onto Middle Rd. Go about 1/2 mile and you will see the first gate for Wild Fox Cabins, continue through the gate for about 1.5 miles until you arrive at the cabins.


CABINS & CAMPSITES

Our eight modern, clean, spacious, and recently constructed log cabins each sleep up to seven people and have an open floor plan and loft. Cabins are located lakeside and are tastefully decorated with a special theme. Cabins have heat, electricity, adjustable hot water heaters, and are fully furnished. ACTIVITIES

FISHING

The clear, spring-fed waters of Junior Lake and the eleven other surrounding lakes of the West Grand Lake Region are teeming with over a dozen species of fish including landlocked salmon, small-mouth bass, whitefish, trout, and perch to name just a few. Junior Lake is a 3,866 acre, “two-tier” lake offering both warm and cold water fishing, and considered by anglers worldwide to be the premier fishing destination in the Northeast. We have the only boat ramp on Junior Lake and our guests have free access to it. The connected lakes are also highly rated by fishermen, and you can fish directly from the shore, rent a boat from us, or bring your own boat and discover your new favorite fishing spot. In winter months, ice fishing is also excellent on Junior Lake.



ATV RIDING

ATV enthusiasts have been coming here for many years to take advantage of the many miles of trails and old logging roads. Explore the trails on your own, or plan a longer trek on Maine’s club-maintained trails.



HUNTING

Wild Fox Cabins is located on 155 unspoiled acres of some of the most fertile hunting grounds in the Northeast. Both large and small game hunting is permitted and abundant numbers of moose, bear, deer, coyote, and smaller game such as rabbits and grouse inhabit the area. There is also an adjacent 300,000 acres of conservation land with additional bountiful wildlife habitats.

BOATING, CANOEING, KAYAKING

There are few places on earth as gorgeous as this part of Maine. Untamed woods, sparkling water, and distant mountains provide a majestic backdrop, and one of the best ways to enjoy it is from the water. By fishing boat, canoe or kayak you can venture into the waterways and small islands found on the lakes. Many of the islands have campsites. Explore the historic Native American canoe routes where you will be wowed by nature’s perfection unchanged by time.

HIKING

A relaxing hike along the many nature and hiking trails is one of the most popular ways to enjoy our picturesque grounds, and the scenery changes with the seasons. Don’t forget your camera, you may see a moose or two, and other species like deer, pine marten, beaver, and otter. There are over 185 varieties of birds, including warblers, loons, American black ducks, Canada geese, and Bald Eagles. In the Fall, dramatic seasonal foliage explodes with colors. “Leaf Peeping” here is unrivaled anywhere in the country.



SNOWMOBILING, SNOW-SHOEING & CROSS COUNTRY SKIING

When winter sets in, guests enjoy ice fishing and other cold weather sports. There are 133 miles of nearby snowmobile trails groomed by local clubs, and connections can be made to the legendary Maine Interconnected Trail System (ITS). Cross-country skiing and snow-shoeing are also very popular in this part of Maine.
